



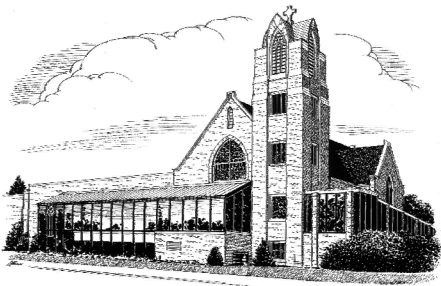

- If you don’t give to the church, what keeps you from giving?

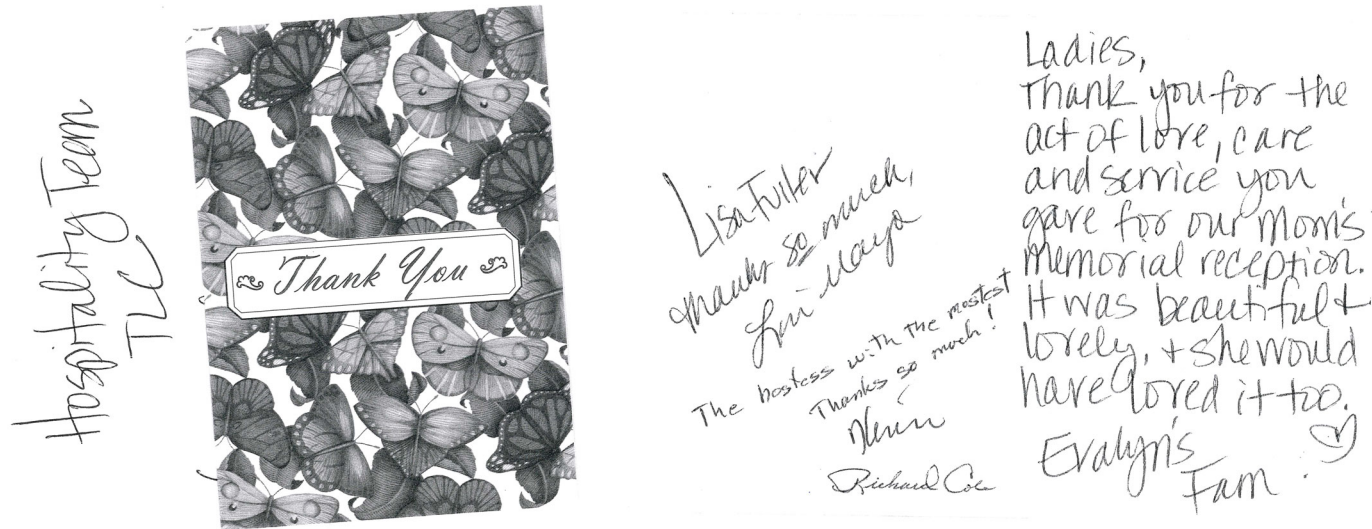
- With kids
