The Blessing of the Animals October 5 at 9:30 and 5 pm


Well-behaved pets welcome at the worship service on leashes or in carriers. Bring pictures of pets who prefer to stay home.



CARES Northwest is passionate about ending child abuse in Multnomah and Washington counties. They offer expert, compassionate child abuse evaluation and support services to children and their families, as well as prevention training and education to child abuse professionals and our community. A Trinity Endowment grant of \$1,500 awarded to Julie Aguilera was used to help Cares NW fund mental health and wellness services for the youth. One thousand dollars of the grant

money was directed to provide blankets, clothes, shoes, trauma therapy, art supplies, etc. The remaining \$500 was used to add another therapy dog for the children.

Oregon Synod Assembly Update:

from Bishop Laurie regarding Resolutions for action passed during the 2025 Oregon Synod Assembly:

Living into our Resolutions

The voting body of the 2025 Oregon Synod Assembly—made up of congregations, ministers, and mission developers of the synod—voted to adopt three challenges:

- 1.Standing with our vulnerable neighbors for the sake of love and life
- 2. Uncovering and listening to the stories of the land
- 3. Affirming our trans and non-binary siblings

The Office of the Bishop is taking your synod assembly decisions seriously. Church is about "we". Synod is about being "on the road together". The earliest followers of Jesus talked frequently about being "on the Way". Sometimes loving thy neighbor takes courage. Sometimes welcoming the stranger feels uncomfortable. Beloved of God, how can we help these resolutions become more than words on [a] page [and become] part of our lives and action in our congregations?

Over the next three months, we will be sharing with you how the Office of the Bishop is taking action to live the work of these resolutions and how you and your congregation will be invited to join us on the path to courageous love.

TLC's Action Committees:

TLC is also focusing attention on these three areas through revitalizing dormant and existing committees.

The <u>Social Justice Committee</u> is supporting and standing with our immigrant neighbors through establishing 'safe' places and supporting Santa Cruz-Holy Cross.

The Social Justice Committee and other TLC members are meeting each Friday from 5:30-6:30 PM on the corner of Powell and Eastman Parkway standing together and holding signs to draw attention to the ongoing trauma occurring in Gaza and the West Bank. Committee and congregation members are supporting a humane resolution to the current Gaza-Israeli War and real and sustained peace. Please join TLC members to draw attention to this crisis that is so severely hurting children and families.

Are you a history buff? The work of learning the history of the land our church sits upon is being studied by the <u>Building Relationships Committee</u>. Please join in this important work of learning about and appreciate the land we use today.

The revitalized <u>Reconciling in Christ Committee</u> is continuing the work already started for TLC using the ELCA Building an Inclusive Church. Committee Members having one on one conversations with congregation members to discuss how TLC can move forward to be an affirming, welcoming and safe space for all including our trans and non-binary siblings.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month.


We will have 2 events on the weekend of October 11th and 12th.
